BRUNTON SQUARE

With the assistance of the Community Payback Team and local volunteers, the first phase of the BEATH EATS project has been created. The HUB office now has an outside growing area which is set out as a demonstration garden with fruit, vegetables. salads and herbs, many of which are available to harvest now for free and highlights what you can grow in a small space. Volunteers are required to help deliver this exciting project in the Cowdenbeath area. The care village is due to be handed over to Fife Social Work soon. It will consist of a 60 bed care home, day care facility and 30 extra care houses. Other features will be a drop in area and café,a hairdressing salon and a sensory garden.

Residents of Jenny Gray House and Valley House have been consulted and engaged in discussion about how their new home will look in terms of furniture and fittings and colour schemes. Consultation has also taken place on what they would like the new home called.

Cowdenbeath Area Committee endorsed the proposed name of the new care home as Lindsay House.

THE PALLY

Geordie Penman built the Empire as a roller skating rink before it opened as a Theatre. In the 20s when attendances began to fall at the Empire, it was then opened again as a skating rink and then a dance hall..when it became the Palais de Dance. Big Bands at the Pally included: Acker Bilk. The Johnny Dankworth Seven. The Clyde Valley Stompers, Joe Loss, Tito Burns Gene Vincent also paid a visit to the Pally and he needed a police escort for his visit!!

ELECTRO MAP AT TRAIN STATION

Do you remember the light up map that used to be in the High Street when you came down the ramp from the train station. It was known as an Electro Map and was installed in 1959. There were 24 buttons each of which when pressed illuminated a small bulb which highlighted a place of interest in Town. The Council

agreed it could be installed albeit they suggested it should be located near the Police Station as that was where folks might go for information. And that location might deter young folks from amusing themselves by pushing all the buttons. Not sure of the date when it was removed but was there in 70s.

THE MAXWELL CENTRE



Work continues on the renovation and extension of the former social work building on Stenhouse Street. Once completed the building will contain a function hall with bar and kitchen, a learning suite, creche, dedicated youth facilities and various multipurpose rooms which will be a huge improvement on the present

community facility in Broad Street. The recently appointed Community Education Worker, Mike Payne, is looking forward to moving into the Maxwell Centre, which is named after Alex and Mary Maxwell, and will be looking to transfer all existing Broad Street Centre groups and activities into the new centre. Mike said, "Broad Street Centre has served the community of Cowdenbeath well over the past 40 years but it is nearing the end of its life. This new facility will house all existing Broad Street Centre groups and I will be looking to develop more for the young people of the area. I will also be looking to develop adult education and in particular IT provision. The Workers' Education Association will move from their present home in Lumphinnans to the new centre and I hope to develop projects in conjunction with the WEA". Mike also said that a Broad Street Centre Legacy Group has been set up to mark the closure of the community centre and to record as much of the history of the centre as they can. The Legacy Group will be number of community events in the period leading up to the closure of Broad Street Centre and more information can be found on their Facebook Page.

SKATEPARK

Weather permitting work on Cowdenbeath's new skate park should begin soon. The sod cutting milestone was conducted at the end of August.

The skate park is part of a wider programme of new or upgraded skate park facilities in the local area. Skateparks in Cardenden, Benarty and Kelty have already been completed. Cowdenbeaths' new skate park will be the largest in the area and is set to be one of the best in Fife.
