Town Centre Development - see correspondence item for update.

**Dog Fouling** – concern expressed about the amount of dog fouling. It's happening all over Cowdenbeath but there was an incident in the High St which caused distressed and concern. We all understand that budgets have been cut but what about introducing more bins in areas and ensuring they are emptied on a regular basis. Feeback from residents around the Park suggest that there are not enough bins and the ones which are there are not emptied very often – they are overflowing.

Questions asked about how many people were prosecuted because their dogs were caught fouling. The answer was 32. How many people were actually reported? Is it possible to publicise what the penalty was for the 32 – perhaps this news might act as a deterrent.

Pavements are in a terrible state. Can anything be done?

**Street lights** – quite a number of street lights out. There is an online form which can be completed for street lights which are out.

**Food disposal bags**. Question asked about the regularity of the distribution of the bags. They are being distributed less frequently

**Trees at Rowan Terrace** – causing problems. Same thing last year. Fife Council came out last year but more needs to be done. What's the progress. GG will talk to Parks and Open Spaces

**Dalbeath Crescent** – Is there any way the small piece of land next to the takeaway can be converted into car parking space. Short answer is NO. Would be costly and not enough money in pot.
